
COULD BREXIT LEAD to the REDISCOVERY OF CULTURE GROUNDED in PLACE?

JONATHON PORRITT co-chaired the Green Party from 1980-83, and acted as the director of Friends of the Earth from 1984-1990. In 1996 he co-founded Forum for the Future and was Chair of the UK's Sustainable Development Commission from 2000-2009, receiving a CBE for services to environmental protection. He has written eight books, including *Capitalism As If The World Matters* (2007) and *The World We Made* (2013). He first met David Fleming in 1977, and as 'David and Jonathon' they set out to articulate green politics in ways that might set the world alight. He is still trying.

SHAUN CHAMBERLIN is the editor of his late friend David Fleming's posthumous book *Lean Logic: A Dictionary for the Future and How to Survive It,* and the paperback version *Surviving the Future.* Shaun has been involved with the Transition Network since its inception, co-founding Transition Town Kingston and authoring the movement's second book, *The Transition Timeline* (2009), and has since contributed to more than ten other

books. He has also served as chair of the Ecological Land Co-operative, director of the campaigning organisation Global Justice Now and advisor to the UK Department of Energy and Climate Change.

DAVID FLEMING (1940-2010) was a visionary thinker and writer who played significant roles in the genesis of the UK Green Party, the Transition Towns movement, and the New Economics Foundation, as well as chairing the Soil Association. He was also one of the early whistle-blowers on oil depletion and designer of the influential TEQs carbon/energy rationing system. Fleming read Modern History at Trinity College, Oxford, and later earned an MBA and then an MSc and PhD in economics (in 1988). These enabled him to better engage with and confound the mainstream, in support of his true passion and genius: understanding that diverse and mysterious thing "community." His Lean Logic: A Dictionary for the Future and How to Survive It was the work of over thirty years.
